Each week for the next few weeks we will include the Saints names the candidates have chosen:

Blessed Hans Wagner: After entering the Carthusians' Swiss monastery of Ittlingen in 1476, Hans Wagner, of Riedlingen, Germany, aspired to an even more austere life of solitude. Consequently, he wrote to Pope Innocent VIII, seeking permission to become a hermit. In a letter dated May 6, 1489, the pontiff answered in the affirmative, beginning his response with a warm salutation: "My well-beloved son, receive above all our greeting and our apostolic blessing!" After receiving this reply, Hans journeyed to Switzerland's Mount Pilate, with a summit of nearly seven thousand feet, settling in a cave on its slopes. The surrounding woods are now known as "the Forest of the Good God." Here he continued to live according to the Carthusian rule, emerging from his hermitage only to attend liturgical rites in the parish church of Kriens, or when dire necessity compelled him. In 1504 a Swiss magistrate and his devout wife, impressed by the hermit's extraordinary holiness, built a chapel for him. Those who knew Hans noted his great serenity of spirit and his deep humility. Date of Death: ~1516 (*Hanz Hababag*)

Saint Guthlac: Born into the tribe of Guthlacingas and probably related to the royal house of Mercia, St. Guthlac (c. 673- 714) served in the army of Ethelred of Mercia for nine years before becoming a monk at Repton. When he took his vows, he restored a third of his war spoils to his victims. His sister Pega became an anchoress. In 701, Guthlac also became an anchoress on an island in the marshes of Lincolnshire. Attacked by Britons and tempted by demons, Guthlac was rescued by St. Bartholomew, to whom he had a special devotion. The fish and the birds (except the crows, who were the most abundant birds in the area) loved St. Guthlac, who died in 714. A vellum roll, called the Guthlac roll, is a pictorial biography of the saint. The site of his hermitage became a monastery, Crowland, which was a frequent place of pilgrimage until the Reformation. Date of Death: 704 (*Guthrie Benda*)

St Julian: According to a pious fiction that was very popular in the Middle Ages, Julian was of noble birth and while hunting one day, was reproached by a hart for hunting him and told that he would one day kill his mother and father. He was richly rewarded for his services by a king and married a widow. While he was away his mother and father arrived at his castle seeking him; When his wife realized who they were, she put them up for the night in the master's bed room. When Julian returned unexpectedly later that night and saw a man and a woman in his bed, he suspected the worst and killed them both. When his wife returned from church and he found he had killed his parents, he was overcome with remorse and fled the castle, resolved to do a fitting penance. He was joined by his wife and they built an inn for travellers near a wide river, and a hospital for the poor. He was forgiven for his crime when he gave help to a leper in his own bed; the leper turned out to be a messenger from God who had been sent to test him. He is the patron of hotel keepers, travellers, and boatmen. His feast day is February 12th. (*Julian Ocampo*)

St Anna of the Angels: was a Dominican mystic of Peru, and she is revered as the second St. Rose of Lima. Pope John Paul II beatified Anna on February 2, 1985 while on a papal visit to Latin America. She was a Novice mistress for many years and prioress at the monastery of San Caterina da Siena. Feast Day: January 10. Birth: 1602 Death: 1686 Beatified By: 2 February 1985 by Pope John Paul II. (*Allyanna Dimatulac*)

St Theresa Coudere: Foundress of the Religious of Our Lady of the Retreat in the Cenacle. She was born in Le Mas. France, in 1805 and entered a community of dedicated women that evolved into the Sisters of St. Regis in 1829. Theresa founded the Cenacle. She resigned as superior in 1838 and spent the rest of her life, except for a brief period, as a simple sister. She died at Fourviere on September 26. She was beatified in 1951 and canonized by Pope Paul VI in 1970. Feast Day 26 September. (*Athea Therese Viojan*)
